# General Information

It is essential to work to the stated tension to ensure success and you should always start by knitting a tension square before knitting the full garment.

If you have too many stitches to stated tension, your tension is too tight and you should change to a larger needle. If there are too few stitches, your tension is too loose and you should change to a smaller needle. Please check individual patterns for tension before starting the garment.

Instructions given are for the 1st size, with larger sizes in brackets. Where only one figure or instruction is given, this applies to all sizes. Work all directions inside brackets to the number of times stated.

### YARN

West Yorkshire Spinners - Bo Peep 4 Ply  
Tin Man (305) 2 [2:2:2:3:3] x 50g

### MATERIALS

1 Pair 2.75mm (US 2/UK 12) knitting needles  
1 Pair 3.25mm (US 3/UK 10) knitting needles  
Stitch holders  
4 Buttons

### TENSION

28 sts and 36 rows to 10cm measured over st st on larger needles or size needed to achieve stated tension.

**VERY IMPORTANT - IT IS ESSENTIAL TO WORK TO THE STATED TENSION TO ENSURE SUCCESS.**



### DESCRIPTION

A SIMPLE, MODERN SWEATER FEATURING A TEXTURED BAND TO THE BODY AND SHOULDER FASTENINGS.

# SWEATER



## BACK

Using 2.75mm needles cast on 65 [73:75:77:81:83] sts.

**Row 1 (RS):** K1, \* p1, k1, rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** \* P1, k1, rep from \* to last st, p1.

These 2 rows set rib.

Work 4 [4:4:4:6:6] rows more in rib, ending with RS facing for next row.

Change to 3.25mm needles.

**Rows 1 and 2:** Knit.

**Row 3:** P1, \* k1, p1, rep from \* to end.

**Row 4:** \* K1, p1, rep from \* to last st, k1.

**Rows 5 and 6:** Knit.

**Row 7:** K1, \* p1, k1, rep from \* to end.

**Row 8:** \* P1, k1, rep from \* to last st, p1.

These 8 rows set patt.

Cont in patt as set until work meas approx. 6 [6:7:8:8:9]cm, ending with row 1 or 5 of patt and WS facing for next row.

**Next row:** Knit to end and **AT SAME TIME** dec 1 st at each end of row. 63 [71:73:75:79:81] sts.

Beg with a K row and working in st st throughout, cont until work meas 11 [12:14:15:17:18]cm, ending with RS facing for next row.

## Shape armholes

**Next row:** K2, sl1, k1, pss0, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2.

**Next row:** P2, p2tog, purl to last 4 sts, p2togtbl, p2. 59 [67:69:71:75:77] sts.

These 2 rows set armhole shaping.

Dec 1 st as set at each end of next 3 rows, then on 1 [2:2:2:2:2] foll RS rows. 51 [57:59:61:65:67] sts. \*\*

Cont without shaping until armhole meas 10 [11:11:12:12:13]cm, ending with RS facing for next row.

## Shape shoulders

Cast off 6 [7:7:8:8:9] sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Cast off 7 [8:8:8:9:9] sts at beg of next 2 rows. 25 [27:29:29:31:31] sts.

Cast off rem 25 [27:29:29:31:31] sts.

## FRONT

Work as given for Back to \*\*.

Cont until armhole meas 6 [7:7:7:7] cm for all sizes, ending with RS facing for next row.

## Shape front neck

**Next row:** K17 [19:19:20:22:23], turn and leave rem 34 [38:40:41:43:44] sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Dec 1 st at neck edge of next 4 [4:4:4:5:5] rows. 13 [15:15:16:17:18] sts.

Work 1 [1:1:3:2:4] rows, ending with RS facing for next row.

(Work should now meas 8 [9 [9:10:10:11]cm, the last 2cm needed to match the back are formed by the shoulder buttonband)

## Shape shoulder

**Next row:** Cast off 6 [7:7:8:8:9] sts, knit to end.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 7 [8:8:8:9:9] sts.

With RS facing, cast off 17 [19:21:21:21:21] sts for front neck, rejoin yarn to rem sts and knit to end.

Dec 1 st at neck edge of next 4 [4:4:4:5:5] rows. 13 [15:15:16:17:18] sts.

Work 2 [2:2:4:3:5] rows, ending with WS facing for next row. (Work should now meas 8 [9:9:10:10:11] cm)

## Shape shoulder

**Next row:** Cast off 6 [7:7:8:8:9] sts, purl to end.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 7 [8:8:8:9:9] sts.

## SLEEVES

Using 2.75mm needles and A cast on 33 [37:37:39:41:43] sts.

**Row 1 (RS):** K1, \* p1, k1, rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** \* P1, k1, rep from \* to last st, p1.

These 2 rows set rib.

Work 4 rows more in rib, ending with RS facing for next row.

Change to 3.25mm needles .

Beg with a K row and working in st st throughout, inc 1 st at each end of 3rd and 0 [4:8:0:4:4] foll - [RS:4th:-:4th:4th] rows then on every foll RS [4th:6th:4th:6th:6th] row to 55 [57:57:63:63:67] sts.

Cont without shaping until sleeve meas 10 [12:15:17:19:21]cm, ending with RS facing for next row.

## Shape sleeve top

Dec 1 st as set at each end of next 5 rows, then on 1 [2:2:2:2:2] foll RS rows. 43 [43:43:49:49:53] sts.

Cast off 6 [6:6:7:7:7] sts at beg of next 6 rows. 7 [7:7:7:7:11] sts.

Cast off rem 7 [7:7:7:7:11] sts.

## MAKING UP

### Front neckband

With RS facing, using 2.75mm needles, pick up and knit 7 [7:7:8:8:10] sts down left side of neck, 17 [19:21:21:21:21] sts from front neck and pick up and knit 7 [7:8:8:10] sts up right side of neck. 31 [33:35:37:37:41] sts.

**Row 1 (WS):** K1, \* p1, k1, rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** \* P1, k1, rep from \* to last st, p1.

These 2 rows set rib.

Work 5 rows as set.

Cast off in rib.

### Back neckband

With RS facing, using 2.75mm needles, pick up and knit 25 [27:29:29:31:31] sts.

Work 7 rows in rib as set on front neckband.

Cast off in rib.

### Back shoulder buttonbands (Both alike)

With RS facing, using 2.75mm needles, pick up and knit 19 [21:21:23:23:25] sts from shoulder and back neckband.

**Row 1 (WS):** K1, \* p1, k1, rep from \* to end.

**Row 2:** K2 \* p1, k1, rep from \* to last st, k1.

These 2 rows set rib.

Work 5 rows more as set.

Cast off in rib.

### Left shoulder buttonhole band

With RS facing, using 2.75mm needles, pick up and knit 19 [21:21:23:23:25] sts from shoulder and front neckband.

Work 2 rows in rib as set for shoulder buttonband. **Next row:** Rib 3, cast off 2 sts (1 st left on needle), rib 5 [6:6:7:7:8], cast off 2 sts (1 st left on needle), rib to end.

**Next row:** Rib 6 [7:7:8:8:9], cast on 2 sts, (rib 6 [7:7:8:8:9], cast on 2 sts), rib 3.

Work 3 rows more in rib.

Cast off in rib.

### Right shoulder buttonhole band

With RS facing, using 2.75mm needles, pick up and knit 19 [21:21:23:23:25] sts from shoulder and front neckband.

Work 2 rows in rib as set for buttonbands.

**Next row:** Rib 6 [7:7:8:8:9], cast off 2 sts (1 st left on needle), rib 5 [6:6:7:7:8], cast off 2 sts (1 st left on needle), rib 2.

**Next row:** Rib 3, cast on 2 sts, rib 5 [7:7:8:8:9], cast on 2 sts, rib to end.

Work 3 rows more in rib.

Cast off in rib.

Placing buttonhole band on top of buttonband sew in place at armhole edge.

Join side and sleeve seams.

Matching cast offs and decreases then easing rem fabric in to place, sew in sleeves.

Sew on buttons.

See ball band for care instructions.

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




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
